Cabinet Members Attend 1st Meeting on 13th July

In line with Lions International requirements, the first Cabinet Meeting for the 2024/25 service year was successfully held within 30 days of the International Convention, taking place on 13th July 2024. This important meeting was preceded by the GAT Committee meeting on 12th July, as stipulated.

During the Cabinet meeting, our District Governor, Lion Dr. Helena Asamoah-Hassan officially swore in the District Officers for the 2024/25 Lions service year. The District Governor also presented the District's goals, followed by presentations from other Cabinet members outlining their area-specific goals and action plans. These plans were thoroughly discussed, approved, and set in motion for the year ahead, marking the beginning of what promises to be an impactful year of service. Since the meeting, Cabinet members have energetically begun implementing their



respective action plans, driving forward our shared mission of service.

District 418 Marks Its First District Governor's Investiture and Fundraising Dinner



20th July 2024 On Lions International, District 418, held a Investiture successful and Fundraising Dinner at Lancaster Hotel, Accra, aimed at supporting high-impact community service projects. The event, which saw the formal investiture of Lion Dr. Helena Asamoah-Hassan as our new District Governor for the Lions year, also served as a platform to mobilize resources for critical humanitarian initiatives.

The fundraising effort was

targeted at the following impactful activities:

- 1. Construction of the Lions International Diabetic Emergency Ward and OPD Clinic at the Suntreso Government Hospital, Kumasi.
- 2. Cataract surgeries for 100 persons to restore sight and improve the quality of life for individuals in need.
- 3. Branding of Police barriers and the erection of safety signs to promote road safety and reduce accidents.

District Governor's Club Visits

From 4th August to 1st September 2024, our District Governor visited various Lions Clubs across the District, starting with Kasoa Kascity Lions Club and concluding with Akosombo Lions Club. These visits were more than just meetings; they were heartfelt gatherings filled with the exchange of ideas, aspirations, and a shared commitment to service.







Run Against Childhood Cancer (21km/5km) - A Childhood Cancer Awareness Activity

On 7th September 2024, Lions International, District 418 - Ghana, partnered with Lifeline for Childhood Cancer Ghana and the Millennium Marathon 2024 to champion the "Run Against Childhood Cancer" awareness campaign held in Osu, Accra. Nearly 180 Lions and Leos from clubs across the District joined the walk. During the walk, participants handed out educative leaflets and engaged the local community on the early warning signs of childhood cancer, spreading crucial information that could help save lives. This impactful event combined athletic endurance with a mission to shed light on the critical issue of childhood cancer in Ghana, especially due to the alarming rates of late diagnoses and unreported cases. The event featured a 21 km race for professional athletes and a 5 km walk/jog for non-professionals.





Accra Ubuntu Donates to the 37 Diabetic Clinic

On August 9th, 2024, Accra Ubuntu made a donation to the 37 Military Hospital's Diabetic Clinic. The club provided an office desk, waiting chairs, and a flat-screen television to enhance the clinic's patient experience. The television will be used to deliver educational content to patients during treatment and reviews, promoting better diabetes management.









SOD CUTTING OF LIONS INTERNATIONAL DIABETIC EMERGENCY WARD AND OPD CLINIC



The District Governor on 26th September 2024 cut the sod for the construction of the Lions International Diabetic Emergency Ward and OPD Clinic at the Suntreso Government Hospital, Kumasi. She was assisted by Dr. Thomas Agyarko Poku, the Medical Superintendent of the Hospital, and a representative of Bantamahene. In

attendance were some members of the District Cabinet, members of the project

committee, a cross-section of Lions based in Kumasi, and staff of the hospital.

The project, an initiative of the District Governor, will go a long way to improve the chances of diabetes prevention, care, and management. Indeed, the project buttresses our long-held commitment to improve healthcare for persons with diabetes.



Youth Empowerment in Export Forum

Accra Omega Lions Club leads a group of clubs to undertake a youth activity dubbed "Youth Empowerment in Export Forum" on Friday, 23rd August 2024. The event was honoured by the District Governor, and Mr. Albert Kassim Diwura, the Deputy CEO of GEPA. It was held at the GEPA head office and attracted over 50 young entrepreneurs from various sectors. The other participating clubs are Tema Supreme Lions Club, Accra Diamond Lions Club, Tema Oak Lions Club, and Kumasi Royal Lions Club.







Tema Oak and Kumasi Providence Lions Clubs Undertake Vocational and Entrepreneurial Skills Empowerment Activity



In August 2024, the Tema Oak and Kumasi Providence Lions Clubs collaborated to empower individuals within the Tema and Ashaiman municipalities with valuable vocational and entrepreneurial skills. This initiative was aimed at equipping participants with practical knowledge to enhance their economic independence and improve livelihoods.

On 17th August 2024, the Accra Aquila Lions Club successfully empowered 100 individuals in Akyem Small London and Asene Manso Akroso District with essential vocational skills. The training, themed "Empowering Futures: Coconut Biscuit Entrepreneurship for Young Girls," focused on equipping participants, especially young girls, with the knowledge and skills to produce coconut biscuits, providing them with an opportunity to create sustainable livelihoods.

Free Spirometry Activity to Mark World Lung Health Day 2024





In observance of World Lung Health Day 2024, the Accra Harmony Lions Club with support from Achimota Golf Hills Lions Club collaborated with Babychildandco to undertake an environment-cause activity. The team conducted lung function tests for students at the Ayalolo Cluster of Schools in Agbogbloshie and traders at the Agbogbloshie Vegetable Market. Being the most air-polluted community in Ghana, the event also aimed to raise awareness about lung health and the need for pollution-free environment among the students, teachers, and traders.



Youth Literacy Development Activity

On 12th September 2024, the Accra Premier Lions Club organized a youth-focused literacy development activity at the Dodowa Methodist A&B Cluster of Schools. As part of the club's commitment to supporting education and empowering young learners, 1,000 Lions-branded exercise books and 12 school bags were donated to needy pupils in the school. This initiative aimed to alleviate the challenges some students face in accessing basic learning materials, thereby fostering a better learning environment.



Donation to the Accra Psychiatric Hospital



On National Volunteer Day 2024, Accra Gye Nyame Lions and Leos Clubs, in collaboration with Accra City Leo Club and iDonate GH, donated assorted items to the Accra Psychiatric Hospital. The donation



included essential supplies aimed at supporting the well-being of patients. In addition to the donation, the group also undertook a general cleaning exercise within the hospital premises, helping to create a cleaner and healthier environment.

Dental Health and Eye Screening at Akuse Prison



On 20th September 2024, Tema Lions and Akosombo Lions Clubs jointly organized a dental health and eye screening exercise at the Akuse Prison. This initiative aimed to improve the well-being of inmates by addressing their

dental and visual health needs. Many prisoners benefited from the screening, receiving essential care and referrals for further treatment where necessary.
