The Club's Executive Members agreed to the Chief's request. As part of his contribution to the Club's project, the Chief gave a parcel of land to be developed into a CHPS Compound to serve the people of Fafraha.





LEGON LIONS CLUB Tree Planting Activity

The Legon Lions Club on Saturday the 17th of October, 2020, undertook a tree planting activity along the Volta Hall avenue of the University of Ghana campus.

The aim of the activity was to plant trees by name MIMOSOP which in the next ten (10) to fifteen (15) years would replace the over seventy years old mahogany trees lining both sides of the road which continue to provide shade.

Trees planted were one hundred and sixty (160) covering a distance of about one kilometer.

The activity would benefit about 30,000 residents of the community made up of Senior and Junior members as well as other staff of the University. It will also benefit visitors who use the avenue for exercise such as jogging, due to the shades they provide.

Eighteen members of Legon Lions Club participated in the activity including the Zone Chair and Immediate Past District Governor of District 418.
